Appendix 7: Pre-Operative Medication Instructions for Ambulatory Surgery Patients

Instructions for All Patients (excluding cataract patients):

Bring all medications with you to the hospital (prescription and non-prescription items) in their original containers, including insulin and puffers	
Blood Thinners	Direction to be given by surgeon.
	Check pre-op orders or call surgeon's office
Anticonvulsants	Take as per usual
Antidepressants, Anti-anxiety, Anti-psychotics	Take as per usual
Asthma medication	Take as per usual
Insulin/ Oral Diabetic Medications	Instruct patient to take half of their insulin dose the evening before surgery, Hold insulin and oral diabetic medications the morning of surgery. Insulin pump: contact your family doctor or internal medicine doctor for special instructions
ACE inhibitors, Angiotensin Receptor Blockers, Diuretics	Hold morning of surgery

Cataract Surgery Specific Instructions:

All other medications:

Bring all medications with you to the hospital (prescription and non-prescription items) in their original containers, including insulin and puffers	
	Take your usual morning prescription medication on the day of your surgery
Unless otherwise instructed by your	Blood Thinners: Do not stop any blood thinner products (Aspirin, Plavix, Coumadin etc.) prior to surgery
ophthalmologist:	Diabetic Patients: Hold insulin and oral diabetic medications the morning of surgery. If you are on an insulin pump, contact your family doctor or internal medicine doctor for special instructions.

Take the morning of surgery as per usual
