Our care approach

The dedicated health care team works with patients to provide care that meets their specific needs and goals.

The Patient Flow Coordinator, (PFC) meets regularly with the patient and family throughout the patient's stay. Together the patient, family and the PFC work toward the patient's discharge back to the community.
